Third Quarter Results with Revenue of \$1,029,139

(TSX-V: **GUF**) an established company focused on the acquisition, management and development of anchored shopping centres in Western Canada, reports a 14.4% increase in revenues to \$1,029,139 in the quarter ended September 30, 2021 from \$899,642 at the same period last year.

In addition, the company welcomes Fire & Flower to Tri-City Mall in Cold Lake, Alberta. Fire & Flower is a leading, technology-powered, adult-use cannabis retailer with more than 80 corporate-owned stores in its network.
